Apple class have been busy again this week,

In English, the children have written a description based on a photo they were provided with. As a class, we came up with a word bank full of adjectives that the class then incorporated into their description. I have also introduced the children to a poem entitled 'Bumble Bee'. During Maths this week, the children have been focusing on addition. The children have had opportunities to solve addition calculations represented in 2 different ways. We will continue to focus on addition and subtraction in our Maths learning.

We will be using battery operated candles to light up our lanterns in a dark room and then link this to one of our Science topics on light and dark.
