This week we have taken part in the global event 'Safer Internet Day'. Children in all classes have taken part in workshops to develop their awareness of what it means to stay safe online. We are currently setting up links to many of the resources we have used, and useful pages for adults, on our school website.

Main Learning Intentions:

- *be careful what you share, sharing personal details can put you at risk*
- *be careful what you share, photos and messages may upset others*
- *be careful what you see, websites and games designed for adults or older children may be frighten or upset you*
- *be careful what you see, some games for adults can be violent and could lead you to play violent games in the playground*
- *know who to tell if you see something you don't like*
