This week in English we have been learning about different persuasive techniques. We have looked at what rhetorical questions are, what expanded noun phrases are and how affect these can be in persuading. We finished the week by writing opening paragraphs to a persuasion text for item to buy. Our Words of the Week have been attitude, carelessly and unsatisfactory. Our SPaG focus is direct speech.

In maths we have completed our statistics unit on recapping tally charts, pictograms and bar charts. The children have impressed me and Mrs Frost this week with their skills in maths.

In science we have investigated reflective surfaces using the torches and different surfaces. The children used the torches and looked at how the light was reflected on shiny and dull surfaces.

In art, the children have sketched their versions of 'The Great Wave of Kanawaga' by Hokusai. We studied the picture and talked about the detail included. The children will then print the designs in the next few weeks.
