



Chestnut Class remote learning – Day 1

Handwriting practice – 8.50 – 9.00am	Please refer to handwriting mat.
Phonics – 9.00 – 9.20am 	Log onto reading eggs and then phonics. Your children can work their way through this. They can click on the different numbers that appear and this will take them to the activities.
9.15 – 9.30am	Take a short break.
9.30 – 10.00am 	Log onto Reading Eggs. Your children can then click on the phonics section.
10.00 – 10.15am - Literacy	Reception – Please look at the pictures and write the CVC words. Year 1 – Please look at the picture below. Can you describe the picture? Please write two descriptive sentences.
10.15 – 10.45am	Please take a break.
10.45 – 11.15am - Maths 	Reception: Practice verbally counting to 10 (20 and beyond to challenge). Ask your children to represent a number between 1 and 10 (e.g. 8, they may bring you 8 pencils. Can they show 8 in another way?) Choose some number rhymes for the children to listen to from BBC nursery rhymes. 11.20 – 12.00pm	The children could use this time to play with their toys, draw a picture, colour or read a book.
12.00 – 1.00pm	Lunch time.
1.00pm onwards – Complete a challenge.	<p>Challenge 1: Play a game.</p> <p>Challenge 2: Complete some finger painting.</p> <p>Challenge 3: Choose a story book. Use the pictures to help you tell the story.</p> <p>Challenge 5: Complete a puzzle.</p>
